## Renters Insurance

Although saving money and limiting expenses are trademark topics of the Financial Aid Newsletter, Renters Insurance is an extra expenditure worth having. According to an Allstate study, two out of three students are not protected against property perils such as fire, windstorms, explosion, theft or accidents. Students most likely have around \$10,000 of property that is left unprotected when renters insurance is not purchased. One of the most common misconceptions about renters insurance is

that the monthly expense exceeds a college student's budget. **In reality**, renters insurance is cheap! An average price for renters insurance is about \$12 a month, plus adding renters insurance to preexisting auto insurance can actually lower your premiums. Another common misconception is that the landlord (or school in the case of student housing) is required to cover property damage in case of an emergency, **WRONG!** They will cover structural damage to the building but not any of your

property. Renters insurance will not only replace your items or give you Actual Cash Value for them, if your home is deemed unlivable the insurance will likely cover your accommodations while you are displaced. If you do get renters insurance you will need to take inventory of your belongings. Taking pictures and a video will ensure that you get the most out of your renters insurance. This small expense every month could save you a ton if something ever happens.

First, Seattle Central Community College (SCCC) right on Broadway has extended their Fitness Center to Cornish students. The cost is \$45 per quarter which is about \$15 per month! In addition to SCCC, 24 Hour Fitness, All Star Fitness, Gold's Gym, YMCA, and Om all offer discounts to students

with ID cards. Visit the Student Affairs Office for more details or just drop by a fitness center. The Opera also offers discounts to students. You can get tickets two hours before the performance for \$20. Also, many theaters in the area offer highly discounted rush tickets. UPS also offers 50% off moving boxes, 10% off packing supplies and 5% off shipping. Desert Sun on Queen Anne offers 40% off all tans. Jet City Improv in the U-district offers a \$2 discount on admission. . Taco Del Mar,

Kelly Ross Pharmacy, Clover House, Daniel Smith, U-Trecht and Arts and Craftsmen, Tougo café, Mad Pizza, and Kinko's all offer a 10% discount to Cornish students and staff. 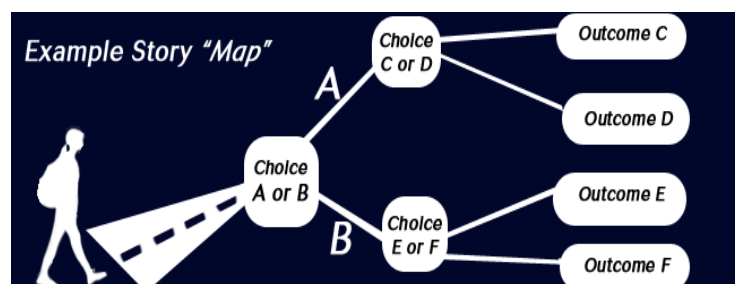
# 2009 Citizens for Global Solutions Multimedia Contest
