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HOUSING INFORMATION 1/2

The Residence Halls

Cornish College of the Arts provides optional, limited housing in the Cornish residence halls for Summer at Cornish Program participants over the age of 15.

Residence halls are located in an urban location near our Main Campus Center, just a few blocks from the heart of downtown Seattle and the Space Needle. Individual rooms are much larger than typical residence hall rooms and each has its own private bath.

A staff member is on call 24 hours every day during the program for support and emergencies. Program Assistants will perform a nightly check-in for all students. Chaperoned activities are provided on evenings and weekends for students.

Cost

The cost of living in the residence halls is \$300 per week, per person, based on double occupancy. An additional \$150 refundable security deposit is charged to all residents. Security deposit refunds are issued after the program ends, less any incurred cleaning or damage charges.

Because of the high demand for space, on-campus housing fills quickly and not all students may be able to secure residence hall space. **The priority deadline for housing applications is April 15, 2010*.**

Meals

The Cornish Café is located in our Main Campus Center, close to student housing and classes. Students living in Summer housing are required to sign up for a meal plan.

Check In/Check Out

Program Assistants will be available to conduct check ins and check outs. Students may check in to their room beginning at 12 noon the day before their first class session. All students are expected to check out prior to 12 noon the day after the student exhibition or last class. Parents may enter the building to help pack up their child. However, please know that students residing in summer housing must be present to give parents access to their space. Security and staff cannot give parents access or a key card to their child's room. HOUSING INFORMATION 2/2

Housing Curfew & Regulations

These rules apply to all students living in the residence halls for the Summer at Cornish Young Artist Program.

Curfew 10 pm, Sunday - Thursday
11 pm, Friday - Saturday

Students may participate in evening and weekend chaperoned program activities or explore Seattle with friends or family. Housing students are required to check in with their supervisor at curfew time every night unless their parents or guardians have submitted a completed permission form to be away from housing for the night.

See the TEMPORARY HOUSING RELEASE FORM. Permission forms must be submitted prior to the start of the program.

Cornish Student ID Cards

During the Summer at Cornish Young Artist Program, each student's Cornish photo ID must be carried and visible at all times. This ID also serves as entry key for all campus buildings and assigned residence.

HOUSING RULES & REGULATIONS AGREEMENT

Summer at Cornish Young Artist Program student policies are strictly enforced. A student found in violation of any of these policies will be asked to leave the program immediately.

Students are required to refrain from the following:

- Use, possession or distribution of alcoholic beverages, drugs and illegal substances
- Hosting an unauthorized guest and/or visitor
- Smoking cigarettes, pipes, hookahs, burning candles, lighting incense, or any other fire code violation in any residence hall room
- Tampering with window blocks, window screens, or placing items in windows
- Tampering with fire safety equipment such as sprinklers, pull stations, fire extinguishers, smoke alarms, fire curtains, or any other fire prevention equipment
- Loaning your room key or Cornish ID card to another person
- Propping open locked doors
- Using bicycles, skateboards, and roller blades in the residence halls or in any other Cornish College of the Arts buildings
- Using frisbees, footballs, or any other type of activity in the residence hall that may injure others or damage property
- Removing furniture from room (*including mattresses, box springs, bed frames, drafting tables, chairs, microwaves, cable boxes, armoires and all other items provided in room*) or taking furniture provided in common area rooms into residence hall rooms
- Using space heaters, broilers, sun lamps, potpourri pots, hot pots, any open coil heating element, halogen lights, or tungsten lights (*for photography, video, filmmaking*) or any non UL or FM approved appliance in the residence hall
- Failing to carry room key, resulting in excessive lockouts
- Using electronic musical equipment and amplifiers in the residence halls without headphones
- Playing musical instruments after curfew
- Failing to comply with fire safety rules

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE FORM

To request airport pickup or drop off by College personnel, **return this form at least two weeks prior to the scheduled date of arrival.** An email confirmation will be sent to parents/guardians once the form is received and approved. Students living in the residence hall may arrive one day before the start of attending student's program.

Notice of Arrival/Departure

In order to help ensure the safety of all students, parents must give notice of the date and manner of pick up and drop off.

Airport Transportation

Students flying to Seattle may be picked up by Cornish College of the Arts personnel and driven to campus. The cost for this service is \$20 one way, \$40 round trip. Students may also elect to use the Link Light Rail Train (schedules and fare information available at soundtransit.org) or use the regulated taxi service outside after picking up their luggage. The cost for regulated taxi service is approximately \$45 - \$60 each way from SeaTac Airport.

We ask that students do not drive themselves to Cornish. Students who must bring a vehicle will be required to pay for parking and will be asked to turn in their keys upon arrival.

PHYSICIAN'S STATEMENT (DANCE PROGRAM ONLY)

Every Young Artist Dance Program student will be dancing six hours or more a day, five days a week, for two to five weeks. In spite of our extensive personal attention and holistic, anatomically informed approach to teaching, injuries are possible. If a student has been off for ten days or more before attending the program, has a previous injury, a lengthy layoff from dance due to illness or injury, or any other physical concerns, it is the responsibility of the student, as well as the student's family and local dance teacher to assess a student's ability to attend the program. **Any concern must be taken to the student's doctor prior to enrollment in the program.** Often it is better to wait a year in order to attend as a healthy student than unnecessarily stress the body and run the risk of not being able to complete the program. Cornish Young Artist Dance program strongly recommends that a student with a recent injury, lengthy layoff from dance due to illness, or any other reason not attend this summer.
