Nostalgia for the Future


Statement of Intent

Set in the ruins of the Archibald mill in Dundas, Minnesota, this project will consist of a gallery, residence, and studio. The gallery will intersect with the ruins themselves slicing through the walls. The residence is set in the historical mechanical building that is offset from the gallery space and mill ruins. A bridge connects these spaces to the studio that exists on an island in the river where a grain mill once was. By creating a local, accessible retreat for these artists where the history of industry is mixed with the future of art, the goal is to restore artists within their practice so that they are able to be a part of our changing future.







